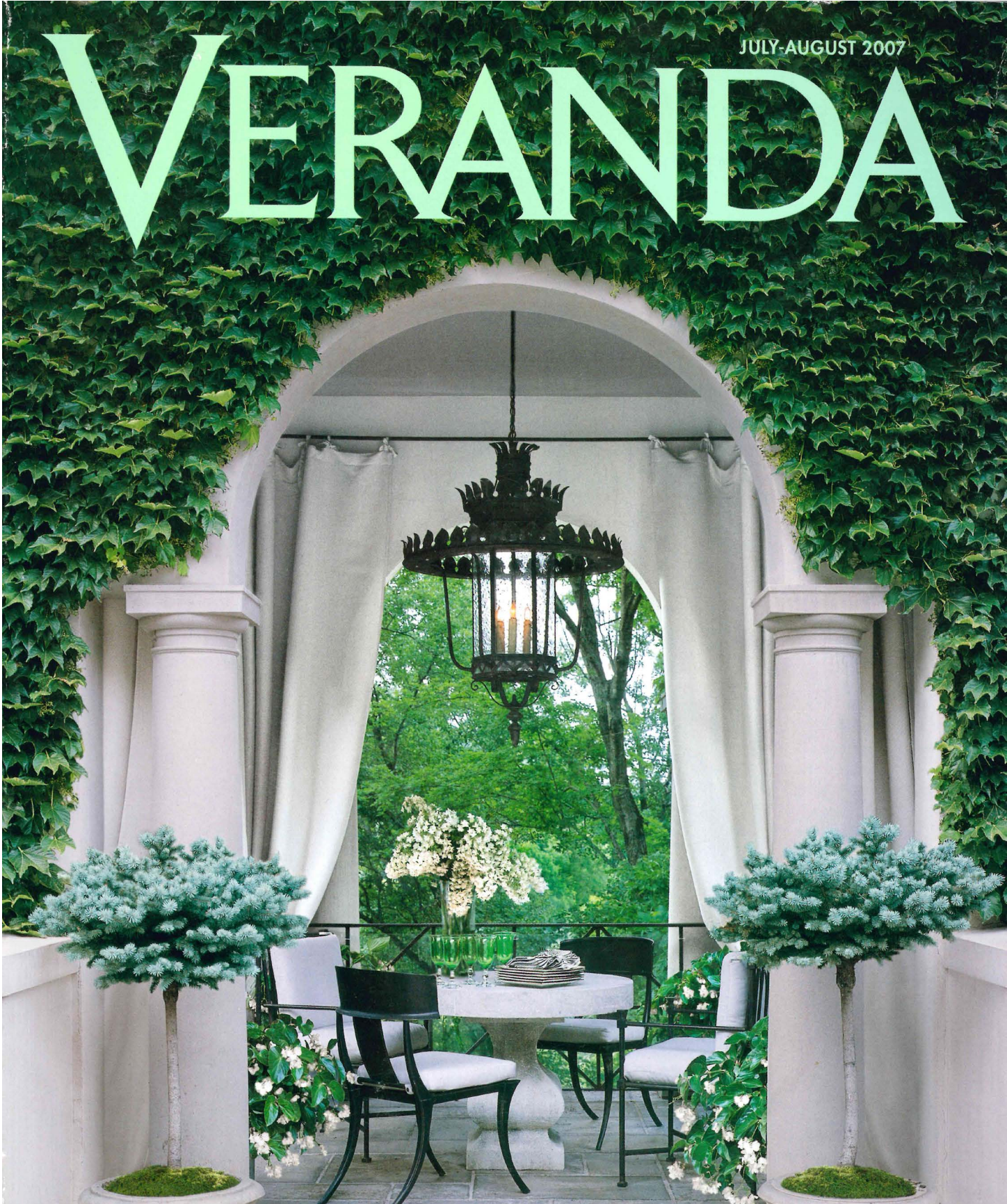

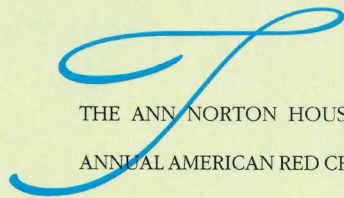

Lisa Kanning embellishes the second-floor study with a delicate, handmade wallpaper inspired by the elegant walls of the China Tang Restaurant in London's Dorchester Hotel. The wallpaper's embroidered silk blossoms create a peaceful retreat into nature, complemented by stylized French furnishings, an oversize ottoman and striking animal print rug. If the walls were not precious enough, the ceiling is decorated with iridescent, mother-of-pearl tiles that add to the quiet sophistication. A hint of chinoiserie imbues this seamless sea of bamboo and flowers enlivening the Norton hallway bath by Cristina Keogh. Inspired by surrounding gardens, the designer brings the outdoors in with a blue and white botanical pattern, incorporating the same color scheme throughout the house. The matching fabric and wallpaper above the chair rail create a graceful backdrop on walls, vanity and dressing table without overpowering the small space. "Because of its size, I felt that the wallpaper and fabric actually opened up the room and gave it light of its own since it had no natural light," says Keogh. "It's a classic print with a little twist that sets the mood and is perfect for mixing gardens and the sea."
